## Shared Visions and Divergent Realities: Imagination and Innovation Across the Continents

The seminar has been organized around presentations at different Paris universities where the CSU colleagues will present their research in a full paper format. Paris 3 University has organized a slightly different format with panels bringing scholars from CSU and Paris 3 together at roundtables. CSU IP speakers are scheduled for both a full paper at a given university and for a participation in a panel at Paris 3 on June 20th.
